Single-mode fibers (yellow jacket) are used for long-distance communication with low attenuation. Multimode fibers (OM1/OM2 orange, OM3 aqua, OM4 violet, OM5 lime green) are used for shorter distances and high-bandwidth applications. Duplex cords are common in data centers, telecom networks, and enterprise environments where bidirectional communication is essential.

Connectors

Patch cords use various connectors such as LC, SC, FC, ST, MPO, and MT-RJ. Duplex cords often use LC or SC connectors in a duplex configuration, with two fibers aligned side by side for easy insertion into equipment.
