Depth and Size: Network cabinets are often shallower (around 600 mm or less) compared to server cabinets, which are typically 800–1200 mm deep to accommodate full-length servers. This can prevent proper mounting of standard server chassis.

Load Capacity: Network cabinets are designed for lighter equipment. Servers and storage arrays can weigh hundreds of kilograms, which may exceed the structural limits of a network cabinet.

Cooling and Airflow: Servers generate significant heat and require front-to-back airflow, often supported by perforated doors and hot/cold aisle compatibility. Network cabinets usually provide only passive ventilation or mild fan kits, which may be insufficient for server cooling.

Power Distribution: Server cabinets are built to handle higher electrical loads and include robust grounding and power distribution units. Network cabinets may lack the necessary infrastructure for high-power server setups.

Practical Considerations

While a network cabinet might temporarily house a small, low-power server or network appliance, it is not suitable for standard rack-mounted servers or high-density deployments.
