A fiber pigtail is a short length of optical fiber that comes with a high-quality, factory-polished connector already installed on one end, leaving a length of exposed glass on the other. Without pigtails, every termination in an ODF, terminal box, or splice closure would require field-installed connectors—an approach. Fiber optic pigtails are essential components in fiber optic installations, used to connect fiber optic cables to devices or equipment.
