Mechanical handling: Cables are sensitive to excessive pulling, bending, or crushing, so proper handling during installation is critical . Maintenance: Markers and documentation of the cable route facilitate future maintenance and reduce the risk of accidental damage . Environmental resistance: Direct-buried cables are designed to withstand harsh conditions without ducts or tunnels, with performance criteria defined in standards such as ITU-T L.101 and IEC 60794-3-11 .
