- Faulty or Aging Breakers:** Breakers wear out over time, losing sensitivity and tripping unpredictably. Typical lifespan is 25–40 years. If other causes are ruled out, the breaker itself may need replacement.
- Arc Faults:** Damaged or frayed wires can create sparks (arcing), which may ignite surrounding materials. Arc Fault Circuit Interrupters (AFCIs) detect these hazards and trip the circuit before a fire starts.

Warning Signs

- Flickering or dimming lights
- Buzzing noises or warm outlets
- Burning smells near the panel
- Frequent trips even with minimal load

These signs indicate that the distribution box is under stress and may pose a fire or equipment damage risk.
