How to Identify or Connect a Ground Wire Open the distribution box and locate the grounding bar or PE bar, usually marked inside the panel . Connect the copper ground wire from the power supply to the grounding bar, ensuring a secure connection with a screw. If grounding individual components (like breakers or metal fixtures), connect them to the PE bar using yellow-green insulated copper wire of appropriate gauge .
