The switch must be explicitly configured to recognize the team and. All team adapters must be connected to the same switch, which Ethernet ports are configured to use static channel aggregation (additional switch configuration is required); Switch Independent (a default mode) — the NIC Team works independently of the switch; no additional configuration of network. Teaming Mode: This should be set to "Static Teaming" or "LACP (Link Aggregation Control Protocol)" if your switch supports LACP. There are different modes (LACP. NIC Teaming is also referred to as NIC Bonding called by some people, Load Balancing and Failover (LBFO).
