Overview

This pocket guide provides an overview of the requirements for the installation of cables concealed in structures in accordance with regulation group 522. 6 of BS 7671:2018+A2:2022 (IET Wiring Regulations 18th Edition). Other cable types can be buried, but may need a little extra protection to ensure they remain as free as possible from damage.
