Marker tape serves both as a warning and as a guide for locating the conduit during maintenance or expansion projects . Additionally, proper labeling and route documentation are recommended to prevent accidental damage. Best Practices Trench Preparation: Ensure the trench is free of sharp objects and debris that could damage the conduit or cable . Pulling Techniques: Pull cables steadily without exceeding the maximum pulling tension, using swivel connectors to prevent twisting . Future-Proofing: Install extra conduits along the route if permitted, to accommodate future fiber installations without additional excavation . Documentation: Maintain detailed records of conduit routes, depths, and marker tape locations for future reference . By following these practices, fiber optic networks can be installed safely, remain protected from accidental damage, and allow for efficient maintenance and expansion in the future.
