Fiber aggregation is the process of consolidating multiple fiber optic cables into a single high-capacity link to improve bandwidth, redundancy, and network efficiency. Aggregation switches are deployed at the aggregation layer, which sits between access layer switches (connecting end devices) and core switches (handling high-speed backbone traffic). These switches combine traffic from multiple access points and forward it to the core, reducing bottlenecks and simplifying network management.

Types of Aggregation

- Link Aggregation Control Protocol (LACP):** A standard defined by IEEE for Ethernet links. Automatically bundles multiple physical links into a single logical connection. Provides dynamic load balancing and failover by exchanging LACP Data Units (LACPDUs) between devices to determine active links.
- Static Link Aggregation:** Manually configured aggregation of multiple links without dynamic negotiation. Offers increased bandwidth and redundancy but lacks automatic failover management.

Implementation in Fiber Switches

- Downlink Ports:** Aggregation switches typically have multiple 1G or 10G SFP/SFP+ ports connecting to access switches.
- Uplink Ports:** High-speed uplinks (10G, 40G, or 100G QSFP/QSFP28) connect to the core layer, often aggregated using LACP or static aggregation.
- Layer 2 vs Layer 3:** Aggregation switches can operate at Layer 2 (switching) or Layer 3 (routing), depending on network design and traffic requirements.
