Plan Cable Routing: Route reserved fibers along the same organized paths as active fibers, using trays or guides to maintain neatness and accessibility. Implementation Considerations Indoor vs. Outdoor Boxes: Outdoor FDBs require additional protection for reserved entries, including UV-resistant materials and IP-rated sealing to withstand environmental conditions. Slack Storage: Allocate space for slack fiber in reserved entries to facilitate future splicing or termination without stressing the fiber. Documentation: Maintain records of reserved entries, including intended use, fiber type, and location within the box, to simplify future network exp...
