Single-Mode Fiber (SMF) Single-mode fiber cables have a small core diameter of 8–10 microns, allowing only one light mode to propagate. This design minimizes signal attenuation and supports long-distance, high-speed transmission, making it ideal for metro networks, long-haul communications, and backbone connections. Within single-mode fiber, OS2 is optimized for outdoor, long-distance use with lower attenuation, while OS1 is mostly phased out. SMF supports wavelengths of 1310 nm and 1550 nm, providing higher bandwidth and superior performance over distances of tens of kilometers or more, though it comes at a higher cost compared to multimode cables.

Multimode Fiber (MMF) Multimode fiber cables have a larger core (50–62.5 microns), allowing multiple light paths. This makes them suitable for shorter distances, such as LANs, campus networks, and data centers, with typical ranges from a few hundred meters up to 2 km depending on the type. MMF types include OM1 to OM5, with OM4 and OM5 being the most common today due to their higher bandwidth and support for 10–400 Gbps speeds. Multimode fiber is generally more cost-effective and easier to install for indoor applications, but it suffers from modal dispersion over longer distances, limiting its range.
