Custom and Specialized Lengths In complex or high-performance setups, standard lengths may not suffice. Custom patch cords can be tailored to precise measurements, connector types, and specific rack layouts to ensure optimal signal performance and cable management . For sliding servers, additional slack may be required, sometimes up to 80 cm, to allow full extension without stressing the cables .
