However, much of this capacity remains underutilized, with reports indicating that only about 15% of SAT3 and 30% of WACS capacity has been used since their launch. The ACE cable landing station is still pending construction, which limits full utilization. Coverage and Utilization Despite the extensive fiber deployment, a significant portion of the population still lacks access. In 2020, roughly 14 million people, over half of Cameroon's population, had no fiber access. The underutilization of submarine cables and gaps in terrestrial coverage highlight the ongoing "fiber gap," particularly in rural and underserved areas. Efforts by Camtel and partnerships with companies like MTN GlobalConnect aim to improve commercialization and usage of these fiber assets.
