

# How to connect a 12-hole fiber optic terminal box

- 5. Connect to Adapters** Insert the pigtails into the corresponding adapters in the 12-hole terminal box. Ensure each fiber is connected to the correct port and label each connection for future reference. Maintain proper spacing between adapters to avoid signal interference.
- 6. Secure and Manage Cables** Use the fixing rib or cable management clips to provide strain relief and prevent movement. Coil any remaining fiber in the buffer area to avoid sharp bends or tangling.
- 7. Test the Connections** Use a fiber optic power meter or OTDR to verify signal transmission quality. Check for weak or lost signals and correct any issues before closing the box.
