

How to connect the interfaces of the optical splitter

Step 1: Identify Ports Optical splitters have a single input port and multiple output ports. Attach to Splitter Ports: Connect the prepared fibers to the input and output ports. Ensure there is no tension on the fibers and that connectors match the splitter type (e.g., SC/APC, LC).

Step 4: Cascading Splitters (Optional) If connecting one splitter to another to expand the network: Use a fiber patch cable to link an output port of the primary splitter to the input of the secondary splitter. Ensure split ratios and connector types are compatible. Limit cascading to 2-3 levels to avoid excessive signal loss.

Step 5: Test and Verify Use an optical power meter or OTDR to measure signal strength at each output port. Verify that signal loss is within acceptable limits and that there are no reflections or discontinuities. Adjust connections if necessary to optimize performance.
