

How to position a fiber optic router for optimal use

Avoid Interference Keep the router away from high-powered appliances like microwaves, refrigerators, and televisions, as well as metal objects and thick walls, which can absorb or reflect Wi-Fi signals. Avoid placing the router inside cabinets or behind furniture, as this can reduce signal strength by up to 60%.

Wired and Wireless Considerations Ensure your router has a gigabit WAN port to match your fiber plan and gigabit LAN ports for wired devices. Use a Wi-Fi 6 or newer router for optimal wireless performance, and consider a mesh system for homes larger than 1,500 square feet.

Multi-Floor Homes Place the router high on the ground floor to balance coverage between floors. If coverage gaps remain, consider mesh nodes or range extenders strategically placed to fill dead zones.
