

Laying out the cable tray support in the tunnel

Support Systems Cable trays must be mechanically supported using wall brackets, suspended supports, or center suspensions depending on the tunnel structure. Supports should be spaced according to the tray type and load, typically following manufacturer recommendations and standards such as BS EN 61537 for trays and BS 6946 for channel supports. Ensure that supports are corrosion-resistant, especially in tunnels with high humidity or aggressive environments, using materials like stainless steel or GRP (glass-reinforced polyester).

Installation Steps

- Material Inspection:** Verify all trays, ladders, and accessories for damage and compliance with approved submittals.
- Storage:** Store trays horizontally on flat surfaces with timber supports at intervals of about 1 meter, protecting them from moisture and sunlight.
- Mounting:** Attach supports securely to the tunnel structure, ensuring alignment and level runs. Use accessories like bends, T-pieces, and crossovers to maintain continuous routing.
- Load Handling:** Organize power, communication, and signaling cables with proper separation to prevent interference and ensure safety. Heavy-duty trays may be required for high cable loads.
