Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA): Implementing MFA on switches can further secure access. While traditional MFA solutions may not be directly supported on all switches, it can be achieved by integrating RADIUS with MFA solutions. This typically involves using a RADIUS server that supports MFA, allowing for additional verification steps (like a one-time password) during the authentication process.

Access Control Lists (ACLs) and VLAN Segmentation: In addition to authentication protocols, using ACLs and VLAN segmentation can help restrict access to sensitive areas of the network. By configuring switches to enforce these policies, organizations can further protect their network infrastructure from unauthorized access.
