Export Status While Nigeria now operates advanced 800G optical networks, the available sources do not indicate that the country manufactures or exports 800G optical receivers. The current focus is on domestic deployment and network enhancement rather than international trade of optical components . Any potential for export would likely depend on future local manufacturing capabilities or partnerships with global technology providers. Conclusion Nigeria has successfully implemented 800G optical technology domestically, significantly boosting broadband capacity and network resilience.
