- Drop-Outs and Cable Entries:** Allow cables to exit trays safely to connect to desks, equipment, or wall outlets without sharp bends ().
- Support and Spacing:** Trapeze hangers, wall brackets, and center-span supports maintain tray stability and prevent sagging. Rung spacing of 150–230 mm is recommended for even support ().
- Protection and Labeling:** Covers protect cables from dust and mechanical damage. Clear labeling ensures easy identification and maintenance ().

Material Selection

- Steel or Stainless Steel:** Common for durability and load-bearing capacity; may be galvanized for corrosion resistance ().
- Aluminum:** Lightweight and corrosion-resistant, suitable for office ceilings or exposed areas ().
- Fiberglass (FRP):** Non-conductive and corrosion-resistant, ideal for areas with moisture or chemical exposure ().

- Maintain minimum bend radius for cables to prevent damage ().
