Installation and Wiring The sub-panel is connected to the main panel via feeder wires, protected by a large breaker in the main panel. It is typically installed closer to the area it serves, such as a basement, garage, or utility room, to reduce long wiring runs. The sub-panel distributes single-phase 220V power to individual circuits, while larger residential sub-panels may handle three-phase power for heavier loads. Proper separation of neutral and ground in the sub-panel is essential to prevent electrical hazards.
