This setup requires two splitters: one to combine signals at the source and one to separate them at the destination. Limitations Bandwidth Sharing: Both devices share the same cable bandwidth, which can reduce network speed if both are actively transmitting data. Speed Restriction: Splitters typically support up to 100 Mbps per connection. They cannot support gigabit Ethernet (1000 Mbps) because gigabit requires all four pairs of wires. No Traffic Management: Unlike switches, splitters do not manage data packets or prevent collisions, so performance may degrade under heavy network load. When to Use Ethernet splitters are suitable for minor setups with low data traffic, such as connecting two devices to a single wall port in a home office or small network. For high-speed or multiple-device networks, a network switch is recommended, as it actively manages traffic and supports full gigabit speeds.
