- Class:** Type of hazard (gas, dust, fibers)
- Division:** Frequency of hazardous substance presence
- Group:** Specific type of explosive material
- Temperature Class (T-Code):** Maximum surface temperature of equipment, which must remain below the ignition point of surrounding materials

Certifications such as ATEX (mandatory in the EU) and IECEx (international standard) verify that equipment is safe for explosive atmospheres. Selecting CAC components with these certifications ensures that enclosures, doors, and cooling units do not ignite hazardous substances.
