VDM provides detailed metrics such as signal-to-noise ratio, pre-FEC bit error rates, and laser aging, allowing proactive maintenance and performance monitoring of optical links. Troubleshooting Considerations When using optical modules, ensure that: The module type matches the fiber type (single-mode modules with single-mode fiber, multimode modules with multimode fiber). Transmit and receive power levels are within acceptable ranges. Ports are enabled and not administratively shut down. Only certified modules are used to avoid connectivity issues.
