26 mm² (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm² must be used. The National Electrical Code (NEC) provides clear guidelines for ground wire sizing through Table 250.122, but understanding how to apply these requirements correctly can make the difference between a safe installation and a costly code violation. Connecting the receptacle grounding terminal to the metal box ensures an effective ground-fault current path. The basic rule achieves this through an equipment grounding jumper; four exceptions allow other methods.
