- Centralized Management:** They provide a single point for managing network traffic and security policies, though complex policy enforcement is typically delegated to distribution switches to avoid performance degradation.

Characteristics Core switches are high-capacity, high-performance Layer 3 devices optimized for speed, reliability, and fault tolerance. They are engineered to handle the backbone traffic of large enterprise networks, ensuring that data flows seamlessly between distribution layers without being slowed by edge-level processing.
