Power Distribution Blocks (PDBs) and Terminal Blocks: For feeder circuits in industrial control panels, UL508A requires 1 inch of air spacing and 2 inches over surfaces at 600V between uninsulated live parts and grounded parts or between live parts of opposite polarity. Listed PDBs (UL1953) meet these spacing requirements “as is,” while recognized terminal blocks (UL1059) must be verified for spacing suitability based on their group classification (A, C, or D) and voltage/current ratings.

Wire Management Inside Distribution Boxes: Wires should be neatly organized, avoiding unnecessary crossing to reduce the risk of short circuits. Proper insulation and secure connections are essential; loose or exposed wires can cause sparking or overheating. Use cable ties, channels, or DIN rails to maintain separation and prevent mechanical stress on conductors.

Clearances for Maintenance and Safety: Maintain front clearance of at least 3 feet, side clearance of 30 inches or the width of the equipment, and headroom of at least 6½ feet to allow safe access for inspection and maintenance. Ensure that protective devices like breakers or fuses are correctly rated for each circuit to prevent overloading and maintain safe spacing between energized components.

Voltage and Current Considerations: Spacing requirements may vary with voltage levels, short-circuit current ratings, and the type of overcurrent protection used. For higher voltages or industrial applications, always refer to specific UL, NEC, or IEEE standards to confirm minimum spacing and clearances.
