

What does the fiber optic cable number mean

- Bandwidth/Transmission Distance:** Some cables include numbers like "500 MHz-km," indicating the data-carrying capacity over a given distance.
- Wavelength:** Numbers in nanometers (nm) indicate the optimal operating wavelength, e.g., 1310 nm or 1550 nm for singlemode, 850 nm or 1300 nm for multimode.
- Environmental Ratings:** Codes such as OFNP, OFNR, or armored designations indicate the cable's suitability for indoor, riser, plenum, or outdoor use.
- Color Coding for Fiber Identification:** Inside the cable, individual fibers are color-coded to identify each fiber or tube. Standard colors include blue, orange, green, brown, sl...
