Functionality Voltage-controlled dimming: The module adjusts lamp brightness proportionally to the input voltage. Less than 0.2V turns the lamp fully off, and more than 9.8V turns it fully on. PWM operation: Many negative control dimmers use pulse-width modulation (PWM) to regulate the current to LEDs, providing smooth dimming without flicker. Compatibility: Works with standard 0-10V or 1-10V control signals, making it suitable for integration with building automation systems.
