Hierarchical Placement In a three-tier network architecture, the core switch sits at the top:

- Core Layer:** Backbone of the network, handling high-speed routing and switching of data packets.
- Distribution Layer:** Intermediate layer that aggregates traffic from access switches and forwards it to the core.
- Access Layer:** Connects end devices like computers and printers to the network.

In smaller networks, a collapsed core architecture may combine core and distribution functions into a single device.

Key Features

- High throughput and low latency for large-scale traffic handling.
- Redundancy:** Dual power supplies, hot-swappable modules, and protocols like HSRP or VRRP for failover.
- Scalability:** Modular chassis or stackable designs to accommodate network growth.
- Advanced buffering:** Large port buffers to handle burst traffic and prevent packet loss.
- Support for high-speed ports:** Ranging from 10G to 400G+.
- Management and security:** ACLs, 802.1X, SNMP, CLI/Web GUI, and network access control.

Console Access To manage a core switch, a console connection is typically used. This involves connecting a PC to the switch's console port using an RS232-RJ45 cable or a USB-RS232 adapter. Terminal applications like PuTTY, Tera Term, or SecureCRT are used to access the switch CLI. Ensure the correct COM port...
