

What is the access point of a switch

VLAN Mapping: Many APs can broadcast multiple SSIDs, each mapped to a specific VLAN. For example, a corporate SSID might map to VLAN10, while a guest SSID maps to VLAN20. The switch port connecting the AP can be configured as a trunk to carry multiple VLANs or as an access port for a single VLAN.

Power over Ethernet (PoE): Modern switches often provide PoE, allowing APs to receive both power and data over a single Ethernet cable, simplifying deployment.

Traffic Handling: The AP does not route traffic or assign IP addresses (unless in special router mode); it simply passes wireless client traffic to the switch, which then forwards it to the correct network segment.

Practical Example

A typical setup in an office might look like this: Router → Switch → Access Point → Wireless Clients. Here, the switch provides the wired backbone, and the AP extends network access wirelessly. Proper configuration ensures that wireless clients are assigned to the correct VLAN and can communicate efficiently with other network resources.
