

What is the height of a secondary distribution box

Ground-mounted boxes should be raised 2 to 4 inches to avoid moisture damage. Key Considerations Accessibility: Ensure the box is easy to reach for routine inspections, maintenance, and emergency operations. A height that allows technicians to work without ladders or excessive bending is ideal. Safety: Avoid wet areas, direct water exposure, or locations prone to accidental impacts. Proper height placement reduces the risk of electrical hazards. Consistency: In large installations, such as malls or industrial plants, maintain a consistent height for all boxes to facilitate maintenance and operational efficiency. Clearance: Maintain at least 800mm of unobstructed space in front of the box for safe operation and maint...
