This results in minimal dispersion and is ideal for long-distance, high-speed transmission . Multi-mode fibers support multiple modes, where light reflects at various angles within the core. Each mode travels a slightly different path, causing modal dispersion, which limits the effective transmission distance . The number of modes depends on the core diameter, refractive index, and wavelength of light. For example, a multimode fiber with a 105 μm core and 0.22 numerical aperture can support over a thousand modes simultaneously .
