

Which port on the router is for fiber optic cable

- 4. Optional Direct Fiber-Ready Routers** Some modern routers have SFP or fiber ports that allow direct fiber connection without an ONT. In such cases, the fiber cable can plug directly into the router's SFP/fiber port, but this is less common in residential setups.

Key Points Always connect the fiber cable to the ONT first, not directly to a standard router unless it has a dedicated fiber port. The router's WAN port is the correct interface for receiving the internet signal from the ONT. Use proper Ethernet cables and ensure the ONT and router are powered in the correct sequence to establish a stable connectio...
